Enjoy the majesty of Mount Fuji seen from the Tokai Nature Trail.

The course through Koyodai, Sankodai, and Gokodai is ideal for family hikers seeking a gentle trail across the mountains. The Tokai Nature Trail links Tokyo's Meiji no Mori Takao Quasi-National Park and Osaka's Meiji no Mori Mino Quasi-National Park. The trail is 1,343 km long and winds through the natural scenery of Tokyo, Kanagawa, Yamanashi, Shizuoka, Aichi, Gifu, Mie, Shiga, Kyoto, Nara, and Osaka Prefectures. Within that route, the course mentioned above is particularly rich in excellent views, so it was first created as a model route during the inception of the trail.



This spot is located twenty minutes' walk from Koyodai and allows you to see the three lakes.

The spacious plaza is widely used by excursion and tour groups as a rest stop.
